Curated by Gabriella Uhl, Negative Room is an invitation to dwell in the unsaid, to see what emerges when the obvious steps aside. This exhibition gathers images that breathe in their own stillness fragments of time suspended between presence and absence, form and silence. The works do not rush to explain; they linger, they suggest, they leave room. Space becomes a voice, emptiness a kind of gravity. In this quiet tension, each photograph becomes a threshold, an opening into something deeper, unresolved, and profoundly human. Participating artists are Tibet Aslan, Jozef Doci, Irina Koplanova, Anna Pomidorova and Stefan Ragimov.









Gabriella Uhl, PhD, is an art historian, critic, curator and a lecturer; she lives and works between Budapest, Hungary and Barcelona, Spain. Currently she is the chief curator oBiannial festival of Photography Budapest, Photomonth working with leading New York-based Diller Scofidio + Renfro (DS+R) architecture and design studio and Stuttgart-based Atelier Brückner. Since 2023 she is the director of Zema Contemporary Art Gallery in Barcelona. Uhl became the Chief Curator of the Biannial festival of Photography Budapest, Photomonth since 2012 in a frame of the European Month of Photography (member of the curatorial board). In 2013 Uhl was appointed as a curator for the National Pavilion of Hungary at the 55th Venice Biennale with the project "Fired but Unexploded". She curated numerous exhibitions and projects. She regularly takes part at conferences and research labs, has been a recipient of several research grants. Uhl contributes to various art catalogues and other publications.

Gabriella Uhl was an associate professor at Kaposvár University, the Budapest Metropolitan University and recently Széchenyi István University, Győr, where she lectures on art history, theory, curatorial studies and cultural management. As a member of the curatorial board of the European Month of Photography (EMOP) curating photo exhibitions in MUDAM (Luxemburg), Gropius Bau (Berlin, Germany), House of Photography (Paris, France).



Zema Contemporary is a gallery established in 2023 and located in the heart of Barcelona. Since its inception, the gallery has been dedicated to becoming a premier hub for dynamic contemporary art in Barcelona, embracing diversity across artists' social, cultural, and generational backgrounds, as well as artistic styles and mediums.
